Main themes :	The course deals with the historical and epistemological foundations of Art History and the different interpretative trends analysing works of art.

Content :	The course deals with some decisive art theories as well as with other discourses that interpret works of art (art history, art criticism, aesthetics, sociology, psychology, anthropology, ect). The course will take three main directions: historiography (historical context of these theories), epistemology (critical assessment of the foundations, orientations and transformations of Art History) and hermeneutics (developing interpretative tools). .
