Evaluation methods :	Exam (writing, speaking and dictation) in June.
Teaching methods :	A traditional teaching method and an interactive teaching/learning method are used. The interactive method aims to get the students in active contact with teacher, as well as with one another, to offer to them more opportunities to get part in the discussions and to ask questions more spontaneously. At this stage of learning, the student should take initiative for a more interactive class atmosphere.
Content :	Enrichment of Japanese language skills (grammar) and improvement of communication level (oral expression and listening). At this stage of learning, the student should take initiative for a more interactive class atmosphere.
