## Russian - Elementary level

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Teacher(s) :	Cherenko Ludmila (compensates Zakharkevitch Andréi) ; Zakharkevitch Andréi ;
Language :	Russe
Place of the course	Louvain-la-Neuve
Main themes :	Methodology: The course tackles different topics (such as leisure, travel, home, advertising ). Learning is contextualized by original or edited texts (reading or listening comprehension). Vocabulary and basic grammatical structures are trained, consolidated and extended via written and oral exercises (drills, role-plays, interviews, conversations in groups of 2 or 4 people )
	Code: Ability to master the basic vocabulary and the basic structures of the Russian language. Focus on the ability to communicate in Russian rather on the correctness of the language. However, phonetic correction will be specifically stressed.
	Culture: Special care will be given to raise students' awareness of the Russian speaking cultures at all skill levels.
Aims :	Reading comprehension: o Can read short simple texts. o Can find specific and expected information in everyday material such as advertisements, prospectuses, timetables etc. o Can understand short simple personal letters. 	Listening comprehension :
	Individual: o Can understand phrases and the highest frequency vocabulary related to areas of most immediate personal relevance (e.g. very basic personal and family information, shopping, local area, studies).
	Interactive : o Can catch the main point in short, clear, simple messages and announcements.

	Speaking:
	Spoken Production: o Can use a series of phrases and sentences to describe in simple terms his/her family and other people, living conditions, his/her educational background and his/her present or most recent activity.
	Spoken Interaction: o Can communicate in simple and routine tasks requiring a simple and direct exchange of information on familiar topics and activities. Can handle very short and usual exchanges on very familiar topics. o Can handle very short social exchanges, even though the learner can't usually understand enough to keep the conversation going him/herself.

	Writing: o Can write short, simple messages (for example postcards) or fill in very simple forms.
