Main themes :	<p>The course will be divided into two large sections: statistics and epidemiology.</p> <p>Statistics: Subjects covered: descriptive statistics (variables, statistical measures, distributions), estimation (statistical measures, parameter estimation), statistical test (principles, practical use of statistical tests), introduction to regression models.</p> <p>Epidemiology: Subjects covered: introduction to epidemiology, measures in epidemiology, types of epidemiological studies, measures of effects and population impacts, standardisation of rates, bias evaluation, causality concept, technique performances.</p> <p>Contents.</p> <p>Statistics :</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>" descriptive statistics (variables, statistical measures, distributions),</li> <li>" estimation (statistical measures, parameter estimation),</li> <li>" statistical test (principles, practical use of statistical tests),</li> <li>" introduction to regression models.</li> </ul> <p>Epidemiology :</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>" introduction to epidemiology,</li> <li>" measures in epidemiology,</li> <li>" types of epidemiological studies,</li> <li>" measures of effects and population impacts,</li> <li>" standardisation of rates,</li> <li>" bias evaluation,</li> <li>" causality concept,</li> <li>" performance of a technique.</li> </ul> <p>Method. The lectures will be illustrated by concrete cases extracted from literature. Sessions of exercises will go along with the lectures</p>
Aims :	<p>Using a practical approach, this course introduces students to the basics of common statistical methods and initiates them in the principles and basic methods of epidemiology.
