3. Working group

In Spring 2010, AIECE general meeting approved the merging of the two working groups of the Association on Commodity Prices and World Trade. - The Medium Term Group will organise its sessions with help from the Steering Committee and local institutes in the Spring.

The Spring host could invite local academics with standing to present after consulting the Medium Term Group

- The Steering Committee will invite extra papers from IMF, OECD, ECB and EC for the External Environment and Monetary and Fiscal Policy sessions

 The host will invite local policy makers to present at the Monetary and Fiscal Policy sessions in Spring.
- The Steering Committee and the Medium Term Group will invite extra papers from EC, ECD, OECD and Eurostat as well as from member institutes for the Tools sessions.

This new structure is approved and will be of application from October 2011.
