The seminar aims through case studies to highlight the importance of such an analysis in development.</p> <p>The seminar has two main goals:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Give an insight of the "gender and development" theoretical approaches and the analytical framework; - Be confronted with research realised in different sociocultural contexts and field work. <p>The following themes will be presented:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Gender systems, dimensions and challenges. 2. The contribution of a gender approach to the economic and employment market analysis. 3. Gender, globalisation and migration. 4. Gender in the discourse and practice of different development cooperation institutions.
