Main themes :	<p>The course is divided in two parts.</p> <p>The first one is related to the EU external borders policy and consequently to these topics: free movement of persons, immigration, asylum and visas policies. The ongoing communitarization of these areas will be underlined.</p> <p>The second one will deal with the police and judicial cooperation in civil and criminal matters. Main aspects will be approached:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - judicial cooperation (mutual recognition and enforcement of judgments'- - police cooperation (creation of coordinating bodies, operative information, training of personnel') - EU's relations with third countries - EU's policies (fight against terrorism, organised crime, drug abuse and the trade in illicit drugs') - prospects (Lisbon treaty, enhanced cooperations, 'passerelle clause', ').
Aims :	<p>There are two objectives: on one hand, at the end of the course, students are supposed to have a good knowledge of the legislation, the main cases laws and the uses in the field of free movement of persons inside and towards the European Union.
