Main themes :	In order to attain the objectives that have been set, the course will concentrate each year on a different theme that will allow the relationships between different orientations in philosophical ethics to be seen - concrete issues of "applied" ethics and methodological reflection. The conceptual analysis will be accompanied by case studies.
Aims :	By the end of the course the student shall be able to analyse selected topics in the field of moral philosophy; to develop a well argued point of view, taking a position relative to various approaches to ethics; to use appropriately the tools of research in philosophy and in interdisciplinary collaboration. <i>The contribution of this Teaching Unit to the development and command of the skills and learning outcomes of the programme(s) can be accessed at the end of this sheet, in the section entitled "Programmes/courses offering this Teaching Unit".</i>
Content :	Ethical dimensions of freedom Freedom and autonomy are key topics of modern moral philosophy. At the same time there are serious doubts about the human capacity of self-determination. The course will deal with some classical questions of this issue (determinism, causality of action, free will etc.) in order to discuss them in the current context of the sciences and the humanities.
