Main themes :	Familiarize students with SLA theories and more specifically English as a Foreign Language (EFL). The course will address two main issues: theories in SLA and learner language analysis.
Aims :	By the end of the course, students will be familiar with the main theories and issues in second and foreign language acquisition. Method. Reading of scientific articles, classroom discussions, practical applications, writing of research papers.
