Place of the course	Louvain-la-Neuve
Main themes :	Presentation of the major and minor figures of the Latin literature. Sets of thematic questions calling the overview of the multiple productions of the field. Deepened and controlled reading of a particular author or work. Personal work on a minor author, a secondary work or a specific aspect of the Latin literature.
Aims :	While making it possible for students to refine their knowledge of great fields of Latin literature, this course boosts the discovery, through a set of themes, of minor figures of Latin literature, and discovers the way in which its most famous topics developed, and points out evolution of a legend or a literary genre. <i>The contribution of this Teaching Unit to the development and command of the skills and learning outcomes of the programme(s) can be accessed at the end of this sheet, in the section entitled "Programmes/courses offering this Teaching Unit".</i>
Content :	This course gives learners the opportunity to look further in the study of an author (Ovid for example), one period (Christian literature for example) or a literary genre (the drama for example) or to approach a topic through various masterpieces (the Aeneas-legend in Latin literature for example). The questions examined each year cover the whole field, from the origins of Latin literature to the constantino-theodosian rebirth, including Christian prose and poetry. The course involves many readings of texts in French translation ; the knowledge of latin, although desirable, is not compulsory.
