Main themes :	Main issues in the psychology of language, historical background, mechanisms for the perception and production of speech, structure and working of mental lexis, syntactic processes, discursive mechanisms and pragmatic skills.
Aims :	To gain an overview of the cognitive processes involved in the production and comprehension of language in normal adults. <i>The contribution of this Teaching Unit to the development and command of the skills and learning outcomes of the programme(s) can be accessed at the end of this sheet, in the section entitled "Programmes/courses offering this Teaching Unit".</i>
