Aims :	<p>Improve the knowledge in the field of psychological development in the whole life cycle, respecting the specificities of "life's ages": childhood, adolescence, adulthood and third-age. Evaluate and appreciate the contributions and limits of the presented theories. Bring out clinical and educative implications of this theoretical knowledge.</p> <p>This course aims more particularly at developing the competences of students, analyzing and observing an individual / a group / psycho-educative situation on the field, critical or not.
