Main themes :	<p>Various methods of individual, marital, family and group psychotherapy treatment as well as different sexual, marital and family pathologies, especially : absence of communication, excessive aggression, pathological jealousy, family and marital violence, abuse and incest, impotence and frigidity.</p> <p>Special emphasis is on the concept of the designated patient, rigidity of the system, intergenerational transmission and symptoms as the solution for the survival of the system together with social and legal aid structures and mediation.</p> <p>In the last part of the course, the differential psychopathology of the sexes is covered.</p>
