| Content :                    | Contents:<br>The course deals with the tools and constraints which are determinant for public authorities action: processes of authorities (licenses<br>and authorizations, Police Force and administrative sanctions, taxation) and contractual practices (public concessions, public<br>markets, public-private partnerships).  |
|                              | It also approaches the methods of management of the public services: centralization, decentralization, private management, regulation of the liberalized markets, etc<br>It presents, in relation to these two approaches, the basic elements of civil service law, of public finances legis-lation, and of public property legislation.  |
