Main themes :	The course relates in particular to: - Legislation regulating local political institutions - The application of the legislation - The local competences and services taking place in various fields of Public Action

Content :	Contents: The course approaches, with a strong legal connotation: - The division of competences relating to Belgian local communities - Local Political Institutions (désignation des collèges et du bourgmestre, consultation populaire,) and their management (supervision, financing, staff,) - competences of the "Provinces" and "Communes", in particular regarding the police - organizations depending on the local authorities, - Public policy implying local actors (waste, water, housing policy,) Method: Lecture, during which the active participation of the students is encouraged. Use of printed material (press article) as material of illustration and analysis.
