| Main themes : | This course is designed as an introduction to the analysis of the cinematographic image, via its relation to music and theatre. <br> Following an initial session involving a number of analyses of shots and sequences, the course looks at various art forms in which <br> the various modes of ferpesentation concerned are brought together musicals, melodramas, opera films, filmed balles, animated <br> films and even music videos. The following aspects will be particularly investigated: composition and camera movements, light, <br> the organisation of space, acting, body movements, use of voices, cutting and editing, special effects during shooting or in post- <br> production. |
| Aims : | Introduction to the analysis of the cinematographic image. <br> The theatre has left a permanent mark on the cinema: in areas such as frontality, text, actors, scenery and lighting. So, in a more <br> subtle way, has music, in areas such as structure, rhythm, sound editing and sound mixing.
