Main themes :	To meet these objectives, the course deals with the following : - examination of present currents of thought and of significant documents in order to highlight the requirements, the issues, the difficulties and the chances of Christian interdenominational dialogue, on one hand, and of interreligious dialogue on the other hand; - comparative reflection on these two dialogues.

Content :	The course will highlight the difference and the affinities between (Christian) interdenominational dialogue and inter-religious dialogue. What are its aims and issues? What are its chances and difficulties today?
