Content :	<p>This course is spread over two years in the minor of Entrepreneurship (together with the 1302 course - Financing and managing its project II).</p> <p>In addition to theoretical lectures, the anchor of this course in the news of SMEs and their resources will be testimonials and case studies.</p>
Other infos :	<p>The specifications of this course is identical to the current LMPME1301-finance and manage the project II.</p> <p>The number of hours was split in order to update and make it more assimilated by students. The distribution of topics over the two years will be specified by the holders of these two courses.</p> <p>This course is a prerequisite for students CPME with no prerequisite in management and finance.</p>
