Evaluation methods :	Written or oral examination.
Content :	After an inaugural lesson (two hours), which will establish the link between the challenges to the EU in the areas of energy security, sustainable development financial stability and good governance, 4 sessions of 2 hours will be devoted to energy issues and 4 other sessions of 2 hours to the economic and financial crisis. The professor will explain the main ideas of the course through power point presentations , which will provide the basis for discussions with the students and open paths for more further research.
