Content :	<p>This course is an introduction and information, accessible to all public. The objective is to describe and make intelligible the operation of the systems and health programs in developing countries. The course does not aim at giving students aptitudes as far as health services planning, implementation or management are concerned.</p> <p>For each examined topic, the student must have read the notes and have explored the suggested Internet sites, BEFORE the course.</p> <p>The course must allow the student to clarify or raise objection towards readings, and to ask some questions about subjects in connection with the topic of the day.</p>
