Prerequisites :	Criminal Law and Criminal Procedure.
Main themes :	The course deals with the following areas: - the socio-historical development of the Belgian police systems; - the various police techniques, primarily in their relationship to the investigation of crimes and their perpetrators; - relations between the police services and the authorities; - criminological analysis of police strategies.
Aims:	The course seeks to provide students with the informational and analytical tools to enable them to compare the operation and the activity of police services from both a legal and a criminological standpoint. The course is intended for students undergoing training for their degree in criminology with a police service or a legal service and to those who plan a career in these fields.
