Prerequisites :	The course requires an introduction to moral philosophy at the bachelor level and a good reading knowledge of English.
Main themes :	In order to attain the objectives that have been set, the course will concentrate each year on a different theme that will allow the relationships between different orientations in philosophical ethics to be seen - concrete issues of "applied" ethics and methodological reflection. The conceptual analysis will be accompanied by case studies.

Content :	All human beings are looking for happiness, but in many different and often contradictory ways. Happiness has always been a key topic of moral philosophy. Starting from the idea of happiness, the course suggests a new reading of texts belonging to great traditions of ethics.
