Main themes :	<p>To develop such an appreciation, the students must grasp some of the essential concepts used to understand how language works, both internally (basic units and structures), and externally (in relation to other disciplines). The course will introduce these concepts and will lead into a reflection about the text and the image as the privileged system of signs of a culture, if not of ideologies. The course will also examine different artistic modes of expression.</p> <p>The course consists in: 30 hours of lecture; 10 hours of tutorial; 30 hours of personal study.</p> <p>Content: 1.
