Main themes :	In a first part, a first chapter concerns atmospheric parameters and main data used in atmospheric pollution (Definitions and general data in environmental chemistry, atmosphere, pollution). A second chapter gives general information about atmospheric pollutants (ubiquitous compounds, lifetime, sources and wells, interior air, photochemical reactions, OH [•] radicals). This part ends by a systematic presentation of main atmospheric pollutants. A second part deals with technical process to treat and/or to remove dust, acid gases, nitrogen oxides, heavy metals, Volatile Organic Compounds (VOC) and odours.
