Main themes :	Part I Physics of atoms -The structure of atoms and ions is based on a brief review of some relevant results of quantum mechanics and spectroscopy -Hydrogenoid systems, quantum defect -Many-electron atoms: Hartree-Fock method and Self-Consistent-Field approximation, central field and corrections, coupling schemes, isoelectronic series Part II Molecular Physics -Born-Oppenheimer approximationElectronic states: adiabatic states, molecular orbitals, terms -Symmetries and correlation diagrams of diatomic molecules -Vibrational and rotational states -Radiative transitions, selection rules -Introduction to molecular dynamics NB: An introduction to various illustrations by means of user-friendly computer codes in atomic and molecular structure and dynamics is provided during the supervised practical works.
