Main themes :	<p>This course takes place in a two years cycle. It alternates with course PSYM 2042 In-depth questions in psychology of religion: social approach.</p> <p>The topics broached here consist in a developmental approach in the psychology of religion, and this throughout life. The course will include, on the one hand, specific questions by age (childhood, adolescence, adulthood, old age), and on the other hand, cross questions that relate to the logic and dynamics of religious development.</p>
