## China and World Politics

Main themes :	This course, through the Chair Inbev Baillet-Latour (the EU-China), is an introduction to the role of China in international affairs. The topics are diverse (political security and defense, foreign policy, domestic political and economic, etc.). Foncton and defined the expertise of outside guests.
Aims :	After resitue China within the framework of its integrated strategy (economic, cultural, political and military), the student will be able to understand the role, scope and operation of China in the world. The case studies illustrate the ability of China as a political actor in international relations. Method: Lecture, in the form of a cycle of ongoing conferences.
