Prerequisites :	The prerequisites are the course of respiratory physiology FYSL 1211 and 1311. The main points of the lecture can be found on the lCampus platform.
Main themes :	Anatomy, semiology and respiratory physiopathology are very linked together. The lecture will be given in one hour about the classical respiratory semiological signs which are the anamnesis, inspection, palpation and auscultation of the chest. We will concluded by an introduction to big disorders i.e. dyspnea, cough or thoracic pain through clinical cases in order to initiate workgroups.
