| Evaluation methods : | 1. Compulsory Placement Test: at the beginning of the academic year, all students must take this test. This test is the same level as the exam. On the basis of the results, students have access to the intensive or « normal » course/ coaching sessions.  2. End First-Term Test (10%): at the end of the first term, students MUST take a test assessing the vocabulary (videos/texts/Wallangues), grammar and listening skills covered in class.  3. The Final (Written) Exam: The final exam takes place in May (cfr Moodle). |
