Content :	<p>Thanks to the lectures, contemporary key theoretical issues in anthropology relating to selected themes will be raised.</p> <p>Pedagogy: 1. lectures followed by exchange; 2. portfolio of readings and/or a syllabus; 3. case studies presented by participants and analysed with the conceptual tools provided.</p> <p>Lectures will be based where required on field experience so as to illustrate how anthropology goes about making sense of the data collected.</p>
