Content :	The course will put a special emphasis upon the different aspects of contemporary Indian society, in particular social organisation, politics and the economy. We shall also see how the contemporary political system links modernity and tradition. A special attention will be devoted to the study of economics, both from the local and general points of view. Specific themes will also be dealt with, such as poverty, population problems, urbanisation, etc.
