Main themes :	The course will be devoted to a major theme in German idealism, and refer to a text or set of texts judged particularly good illustrations of that theme. Beyond the exegetical approach required by this type of text and its contextualisation within the systematic development of a given major work, the course will attempt to illuminate the role played by the particular theme studied in the works of various German idealist philosophers insofar as it leads to differences between their positions.
Aims:	Upon completion the student will be able to: - Define major concepts employed by German idealist philosophers; - Explain various philosophical methods that differentiate one philosopher from another; - Interpret in general terms some famously difficult passages with the help of reading hints furnished in the course.
