Main themes :	Two kinds of subjects may be addressed: - In relation with cultural events (commemoration of an anniversary, opera season, festival); - In relation with scientific research (preparation of a dissertation, conference, or book).
Aims :	The aim of this course is to offer a professionalising approach of musicology. The students will be asked to prove their ability to write a short paper on a theme selected beforehand, using correct methodological and epistemological tools. Evaluation methods :	Written paper and oral examination.
Teaching methods :	Part of this course consists of lectures by the teacher. Thereafter, the students will be asked to present a lesson on a subject fixed at the beginning of the semester.
Content :	- Introduction to the general theme, analysis of significant musical texts. - Presentations on specific aspects of this theme, chosen according to the specialisation of each student.
