Main themes :	In order to make students self-sufficient and critical in their research, they will be introduced to the critical and detailed study of a theological or literary question about ancient christian literature or of a historical question about christian antiquity. Individually or in group students will be taught to practice a rigorous method. They will use specialised tools for patristics or history of Antiquity.
Aims :	At the end of this activity, the student will be able to - use the main tools for patristics and history of Ancient christianity; - read critically the ancient sources; - understand and appraise critically articles and monographs on these sources; - produce a clear and scientific presentation of his work. <i>The contribution of this Teaching Unit to the development and command of the skills and learning outcomes of the programme(s) can be accessed at the end of this sheet, in the section entitled "Programmes/courses offering this Teaching Unit".</i>
Content :	This second (and third) level seminar is taught every two years. Usually it examines the topic that was explored in the course Questions of patristics or Questions of history of christianity: Antiquity.
