Prerequisites :	Pre-requisite : Basic knowledge in immunology and microbiology.
Main themes :	Through articles from the literature, the recent knowledge in anti-infectious immunity will be examined. That includes major cells and molecules involved in these mechanisms, recent vaccination methods, and the consequences of infections on concomitant diseases with an immune component.
Aims :	To increase knowledge on the particularities of immune responses against pathogens ; allow to follow and to criticize the literature. <i>The contribution of this Teaching Unit to the development and command of the skills and learning outcomes of the programme(s) can be accessed at the end of this sheet, in the section entitled "Programmes/courses offering this Teaching Unit".</i>
Evaluation methods :	Critical reading of an article to analyze in the context of the course.
Teaching methods :	Each module consist in a teacher's presentation followed by a critical reading of an article by the students.
Content :	The approach will be based on an analysis of the literature, in animal experimental models (mostly mouse) and in humans (AIDS, hepatitis, tuberculosis, parasites). After the teacher's presentation, students will be required to participate (articles critical reading, data interpretation based on the course given the previous week). The course analyze anti-infectious immunity through critical reading of articles.
