Aims :	<p>The student should be familiar with the interdisciplinary regulations and principles of global bioethics of clinical research and the different phases of research ethics.</p> <p>He should be able to articulate universal principles of biomedical ethics in terms of international regulation (Who, Helsinki, Belmont report, ) to the individual capability of medical doctors and researched to apply them in context. The aim is the protection of the rights of participants in the context of globalisation of research.
