Aims :	The course aims at enabling the student

	to develop the communication techniques appropriate to professional life,				
	to improve command of the language (general and specific vocabulary, grammar and pronunciation). At the end of the term, the student should have acquired oral skills roughly corresponding to the B1 level of « the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages ». 	Oral exam (60%) divided into 2 parts: a group exam (role play) so well as an individual exam (presentation of a criminal equivariant at tanic based on a partially of articles)

Teaching methods:	Interactive communication through classroom activities.

	Consolidation and improvement of grammar use, vocabulary accuracy as well as pronunciation.				
	Regular feedback on the student's oral production.				
Content :	The course aims at enabling the student to function in the relevant social and professional contexts (law enforcement, the judicial world, the execution of criminal sentences, the field of prevention policies and psycho-social interventions). The student will practise the language in an interactive way through classroom professional-type activities and will therefore be exposed to a variety of real-life situations requiring specific language functions. Regular feedback on the student's oral production will help him consolidate and improve his grammar use, vocabulary accuracy as well as pronunciation.
