Main themes :	 This course takes into account the principal aspects of the teaching of ancient languages in the secondary school of today: 1. The focuses according to the levels; 2. Reading of authors; 3. Familiarisation with ancient cultures and civilisations; 4. Conception and execution of methods of evaluation adapted the aims in view; 5. Acritical view of the teaching possibilities offered by the multimedia; 6. An analysis of the programs within the framework of the "Missions" decree and within its extension to the different structures of "Final competences and required learning in Latin". This course includes a reflection on the characteristics of a high-quality communication, and in particular its adaptation to the public to which it is destined (a critical analysis of the text-books designed for the teaching of latin at the secondary level).
