Main themes :	In order to reach its aims, the course will focus on the study of : the Protestant Reformation, the Council of Trent and the development of Catholic Reformation (Roman impetus, new religious orders, spirituality, extra-European missions), the relation between Church and State (and the so-called State Catholicism), Christian Enlightenment in the 18th century and the impact of the Revolutions on Christianity.
