Evaluation methods	Written essay with oral defense
Teaching methods	The introduction to the course contains ex cathedra lectures, but it also requires the students active participation when discussing the port-folio that will serve as the basis bibliography for the final essay.
Content	The (ex-cathedra) introduction gives an overview of the history of contrastive linguistics as a discipline. Afterwards the methodological aspects of language typology and contrastive linguistics will be addressed in a research seminar format. The examples that will be discussed are mainly from the Germanic and Romance languages.
