Main themes	The course includes the following topics: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Introduction to codicology; 2. Handwritten copy of ancient Greek texts and textual transmission issues; 3. Ancient Greek writings; 4. Practical training in reading ancient Greek manuscripts (reading exercises); 5. Theoretical and practical training in editing ancient Greek texts.
Aims	At the end of this course, the student will be able: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • to decipher a ancient Greek manuscript, or to find the necessary assistance to read it; • to locate a written text within the history of ancient Greek writings; • to read, analyse and use an edition (introduction and critical apparatus); • to collate various major manuscripts of a given text and to prepare a provisional edition; • to use bibliographical and working tools. <p>-----</p> <p><i>The contribution of this Teaching Unit to the development and command of the skills and learning outcomes of the programme(s) can be accessed at the end of this sheet, in the section entitled "Programmes/courses offering this Teaching Unit".</i></p>
Evaluation methods	An oral exam. It covers : <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - examples of reading; - the theoretical explanations; - the study of articles that are complementary to the theory.
Teaching methods	Part of the course consists of lectures (theoretical explanations). The remainder consists of practical exercises in reading.
Content	According to the year, the course can be devoted in part to a particular category of texts or a particular type of writing; but the principal part of the course always deals with the most important styles of Greek writing in books.
Inline resources	The iCampus server enables the student to have access to the bibliography, some theoretical notes, the list of additional reading and the methods of the exam.
