	All students will have to form an international team (2 UCL students - 2 students from a US university) and will be required to complete and present their own new international venture creation project in cooperation with the US students.			
	The pedagogy will be interactive and will include common classes (videoconferencing, travels abroad, company visits, etc.).			
	The last three sessions will be devoted to the presentation and a discussion of the students' group works or projects.
