Evaluation methods	Students will be evaluated through two independent essays. To validate the associate credits, each essay should be to be successfully completed.
Teaching methods	The lectures will be based on the analysis of test protocols of clinical cases. The main goal is the development the student's critical thinking about tests. Students are expected to work between the main lectures, especially during the practical sessions.
Content	To develop the student's critical thinking about the use of the psychodiagnostic tests, tests from different domains (intellectual development, personality, behaviors') will be analyzed.
