Main themes	<p>To achieve its objectives, the course consists of:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - presenting a historical and doctrinal synthesis of the question of the one God and Triune; - introducing to the current problems, situating them in the contemporary context; - initiating the practice of dogmatic theology. <p>This part of the course includes an introduction to the elaboration of a problem and a practical introduction to the bibliographic instruments; it leads the student to write a work which gives him/her the opportunity to put into practice the elements of this initiation and to develop an active relation with the material.</p>
