| Main themes | In-depth study of classical Latin grammar. This course deals with following issues: 1. Morphology (advanced level); 2. Basic structures of Latin syntax (complementary clauses, function and use of nominal verb forms); 3. Personal analysis and translation of a Latin prose text (cursory reading). The exercises are devoted to syntax, prose composition and translation from Latin. There are also special exercises intended to morphological and lexical training. |
