Place of the course	Louvain-la-Neuve
Main themes	<p>Students will be introduced to the countries, history and culture of people and communities in the Near East with Christian (non-catholic) beliefs. Special regions with Aramaic (Syriac) population in Syria-Mesopotamia are brought into focus. The course introduces into several topics :</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Countries and regions of Eastern Christian communities and their history from the 4th century to Medieval times ; 2. Christian Oriental sciences and literatures ; 3. Cultural urban centres (Alexandria, Antiochia, Edessa, Mosul, Baghdad etc.) and important monastic places (in Palestine, Turkey, Syria, Iran, Egypt, Sinai etc.) ; 4. Main historical features of Syriac christianity in the Near East from the 4th century to modern times ; its former cultural impact in Central Asia and India.
Aims	<p>1 By the end of the course, students will have acquired knowledge about Christian (non-catholic) people in the Near East in their diverse geographic, historical and cultural setting.
