Evaluation methods	<p>The first session (end of semester) overall evaluation covers the student's work accomplished during the translation workshop.</p> <p>Home work (abiding by the terms and specifications of the translation project he or she will be submitted to as well as accomplishing the required « tasks » in due time) will be as important as presence and participation in the in-situ training sessions of the workshop.</p> <p>The student's presence is requested at all in-situ training sessions of the translation workshop.</p> <p>The final evaluation of the translation workshop may be completed or replaced - in agreement with the students - by an in-situ 4-hour translation exam to be completed in the working conditions of a professional translator's workstation during the official examination session. The student will be given a text directly related to the special field of study of the semester, as well as other related tasks to complete in accordance with the specifications.</p> <p>The second session (September session) overall evaluation consists of an in-situ 4-hour translation exam in the working conditions of a professional translator's workstation. The student will be given a text directly related to the special field of study of the semester, as well as other related tasks to complete in accordance with the specifications.</p>

Brief introduction to the author in the context of Russian literary history and culture. Text analysis (genre, style, intertextuality, etc.). Confrontation of individual translations, discussion and justification of translational choices, etc. Comparison of the individually finalized translation with a published one, critical comments and discussion.</li> <li>2. Complementary exercises. Critical comment of published translations of a same text.
