Main themes	This seminar is interested in the international issues of the day. Accordingly, the themes will vary each year. However, every year, attention will be equally paid to transversal and regional problems. Among the first set, issues such as the global financial crisis or peacekeeping reforms will be studied. Among the second set, issues such as the maritime tensions between China and Japan, the struggle for the Arctic, or peacebuilding in the African Great Lakes region will be studied. Themes the students did not have the opportunity to work on before will be favored.
