Content	The course covers the following topics: management and protection of the archaeological heritage (international requirements and translation into laws at the national legislation and regional levels), preventive conservation, restoration and display of the archaeological heritage (preliminary studies, diseases, preventive conservation, treatments, monitoring, reserves and depots management, presentation of archaeological remains, sites museums, decision-making in conservation within various socio-economic frameworks), archaeological practices implementing the Valletta 1992 convention in the concerned European countries with some comparisons with non-European areas, management of the protection (protection degrees, criteriology).
