The seminar can also involve a trip to France or Italy: each student will have an individual research followed by an oral report on a city or an ancient monument. The seminar also can be based on a detailed analysis of scientific papers on a specific topic with presentation (PPT) by students. A series of lectures is also planned, in order to illustrate the different themes of the seminar.				
Content	The seminar is organized around a common theme, treated under different perspectives, promoting a multi- disciplinar approach. The aim is to demonstrate to the students the potentiality of such am approach in order to better understand ancient societies. The theme chosen for the academic year 2019-2020 is ancient wall painting.
